Interior Health inspected our school following the Calvary Chapel outbreak. They affirmed our scrupulous protocols and confirmed that our church rental partnership presents no risk to Kelowna Christian School students. Kelowna Christian School is not seeking new rental partnerships until there is a positive therapeutic response to COVID.

IN THE EVENT OF A COVID-19 SITUATION

Remember that in the event of a COVID situation, if a member of our community is exposed and/or tests positive, our school administration will follow the leadership of the Interior Health Authority (IHA). We have <u>attached a link</u> that helps explain their process.

As a school, we are required by law to protect the personal privacy rights of individuals. As such, and following public health guidance, we will likely be unable to provide any detailed information beyond what has been shared by the Interior Health Region. However, we will

ensure that all members of our school community receive all school communications. We will also liaise well with the media in an attempt to prevent misinformation.

In the event of an exposure, it is essential that we all remain calm and empathetic and share these sentiments with our students to feel safe and continue to focus on their learning. I assure you that our students, families, and staff's safety and well-being is our highest priority in the event of a Covid-19 exposure event at our school.

We will always strive for excellence in education for all students. Our staff are equipped and ready to pivot to an offsite education model on a couple of days' notice if mandated by our provincial health authority. We also will continue to lean not on our own understanding but to lean on our ever-faithful God. We will seek to be a Christ-like community and prayerfully care and love all within our village.

The current pandemic and global political landscape can cause polarizing and divisive view points. My constant prayer is for our Christ-centred KCS village to outwardly demonstrate love in place of division as we seek to be a light, both locally and globally, during this atypical time. Our students are doing great and the past couple of months have certainly exceeded my expectations. God is faithful all the time.
